# Who is eligible to set up a Skillnet Business Network?

#### **APPLICANTS MUST:**

- Be an industry federation, industry body or other private sector enterprise group based in the Republic of Ireland. Enterprises within the network can be of any size, including sole traders. (Public/voluntary sector entities are ineligible)
- Present a strong business case to Skillnet Ireland on the challenges (and opportunities)
   within the relevant sector/region and both the current and future skills required to address such needs.
- Outline how the proposal is **aligned to national policy** for the relevant sector or region.

### How is a Skillnet Business Network structured?

- Subject to a successful application, Skillnet Ireland contracts with the organisation that
  manages the activities of the learning network. That entity receives the funds from Skillnet
  Ireland on behalf of the network group. Typically, these organisations include industry or
  sectoral representative bodies, Chambers of Commerce, employee representative groups
  and clusters of private businesses with similar training needs.
- Each learning network is called a Skillnet e.g. ISME Skillnet.
- Each Skillnet Network is led by a voluntary Steering Group of industry representatives
  that focus on setting the strategic direction of the learning network. This group meets
  on a regular basis and makes decisions for the Network on behalf of the wider group of
  businesses.
- Each Skillnet Network **appoints a Network Manager** who manages the delivery of the Network training and development plan on a day-to-day basis.
- Sectoral or regional networks are comprised of network businesses of any size.
- Trainees include both employees of businesses and those seeking employment that meet our eligibility criteria.
